"We need to tackle this as a community so that all of our kids are safe. When I protected my kids online, I also protected yours, so please, please protect your kids online so that you are also protecting mine" **Rob Cope**. Attendance: Student attendance has a huge bearing on student engagement and achievement. All students must be present at kura so they can participate and engage in learning. Parents and Boards are legally responsible to ensure students' regular attendance at school. Students with high absenteeism are less likely to succeed in their learning. If a student misses five school days each term, or one day a fortnight, they will miss the equivalent of one year of schooling over 10 years. As the level of absenteeism grows, the difficulty of re-engaging in learning can be extremely difficult and this also flows into social relationships.

Justified absences are situations such as illness, medical or dental appointment, funeral or tangi. Unjustified absences are situations such as holidays during term time, unnecessary shopping trips, or lack of interest/motivation. From reviewing our attendance data from last year - we have seen some improvement in attendance and for most of our tamariki their absences have been justified. Let's work towards all our tamariki attending school for 90% or more every term this year. You can help us by ensuring that, assuming your child is healthy, they are at school. If tamariki are absent please ensure you, as the parent, make contact to let us know and give reason why as this is needed for our attendance notification to the Ministry of Education. Nga mihi!
